MANAGER REPORT – From the Bench: We had the opportunity to speak with Ava Lanes who is the author of From the Bench. Ava proposed a beautification concept involving strategically placed benches throughout the community. Ava discussed what benches could do for a community. A place to relax and maybe have a conversation with another community member. Different themed benches may draw people in to visit. "Welcome to Battlement Mesa. Sit and stay awhile."

<u>Maintenance Technician Update:</u> Our Maintenance Technician has been having some health issues in the last couple of weeks. Assistant Manager, Alex Morris, got in contact with Mountain Temp Services to look for interim help. We will have help this week to complete BMSA maintenance tasks.

<u>Tamarisk Meadows Delegate Election:</u> We have concluded the results of the Tamarisk Meadows Mail in Election for the vacant delegate position. We received a total of 26 ballots, and we needed 15% (12 ballots) participation. Leslie Gallagher-Kelly received the most votes with 16 votes, 9 votes for Nicholas Pysto and 1 invalid vote. Leslie will be serving as the Tamarisk Meadows Delegate for a three-year term.

Removal of Dead Trees: Approximately 13 mature locust trees have died over the winter in the Tamarisk Village and Canyon View areas along Rainbow Trail and Stone Quarry Road. These trees are approximately 35 years old. We have received a quote of \$15,000 to remove the tress and grind the stumps.

OLD BUSINESS - None

OTHER BUSINESS – Director Reuter made a motion, seconded by Director Edwards, to pull \$20,000 out of the reserve fund to remove trees in Tamarisk Village and Canyon View areas along Rainbow Trail and Stone Quarry Road and to make the replacement of trees a budget item in 2025. The motion passed unanimously.

Director VanDeusen made a motion, seconded by Director Mohrlang, to sponsor KSUN Radio in the amount of \$1,500. The motion passed unanimously.
