OWNERS OPEN FORUM- MaryLee Mohrlang made a presentation about the upcoming Wine and Beer Tasting and Silent Auction "A Grand Wine Affair" at Grand River Health on September 19, 2019 from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm and asking for a donation for this event. Grand River Health Volunteer Association is raising funds for 2 new "Infusion Beds" that are not in the Grand River Hospital District's budget. MaryLee Mohrlang also presented the possibility for a membership with KSUN Radio. The reasoning behind the request is KSUN's members will help make your favorite programs possible. The membership combined with business sponsorship makes up about 88% of KSUN's operating budget. KSUN is changing the financial year to a calendar year. Therefore, this is a one-time 18 month membership. Members are able to break the membership up into three payments. 1st payment due upon signup. 2nd payment due February 1, 2020 and 3nd payment due July 1, 2020.

Mac McCurdy wanted to inform the board that he wishes to participate in the discussion coming to the board about widening the entrance to Eagle's Point Village.

Karen Duncan wanted to inform the board that there are still broken links on the Battlement Mesa Service Association Website. She also made the board aware that there was a boat at 15 Pinyon and there was a noise issue there with children at the same location. The board expressed that noise related to children playing under normal circumstances is something that is expected in a community with a lot of families. It is unlikely that this issue would be pursued as a covenant violation.

NEW BUSINESS- A motion was made by Director Keller and seconded by Director Reuter to donate \$500.00 to the Grand River Hospital District for the "A Grand Wine Affair "on September 19, 2019.

A motion was made by President Koning made the motion and was seconded by Director Reuter to support the Bronze Level for \$1,500 of membership for KSUN. Since we donated \$300.00 in March \$200.00 will be paid for the 1st payment, then \$500 on February 1, 2020 and last payment of \$500.00 in July 1, 2020. Motion passed unanimously.

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President Koning advised the Board that she had exchanged emails and letters with Ursa representatives John Doose and Don Simpson concerning Ursa's recent decision to suspend their 2019 commitment of \$250,000. Ursa previously provided \$125,000 and \$250,000 for years 2017 and 2018. The 2019 payment was to be the 3rd of 4 annual payments to the BMSA related to oil and gas development impacts in the Battlement Mesa community.

Mr. Doose and Mr. Simpson explained that Ursa is taking a pause in the remaining pledge payments until such time as drilling and completion operations for Phase 2 commence in the future. President Koning's response to Mr. Doose and Simpson was that the language in Mr. Simpson's November 30, 2016 commitment letter was very clear that the payments would be made in 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020 to fulfill the pledge to provide \$1,000,000 to the BMSA to offset the impacts of oil and gas activities in the Battlement Mesa PUD. No reference is made in the letter that delays in drilling and completion activity would delay or suspend the \$250,000 annual payment.

After additional discussion the Board Directed Mr. Rippy to consult with the BMSA attorney on recommended action concering Ursa's decision to suspend the 2019 payment.
