Amie, there was no meeting this month. URSA has their semi-annual meeting to the community at the Library on the 12th. Their plans for 2014 include continued drilling on both the Monument Ridge (MR) pad and the Speakman (SP) pad. These pads are outside of the PUD. MR will have an additional 11 wells drilled and completed over two different drilling sessions. SP will have an additional 4 wells drilled and completed.

URSA is also beginning to look at the 2015 drilling plan. They are potentially looking at Pad G. Options exist for this pad, the one currently shown in the "surface use agreement" within the PUD and one that would be close by but outside of the PUD. No decision on the placement of this pad has been made at this time.

# Planning Committee Report

On March 4, 2014 the Planning Committee held a joint meeting with the Public Relations Committee to discuss the Battlement Mesa Comprehensive Plan. Planning Committee member, Don Gray and Public Relations Committee member, Keith Lammey and Association Manager, Steve Rippy were in attendance.

The focus of the discussion concerned economic development and possible efforts to improve market conditions for residential property as well as attract commercial business.

A large part of the discussion was directed toward the current economic conditions of the residential housing market. Different ideas were discussed about methods of marketing the inexpensive price of housing, low property taxes, golf course and recreation center amenities as well as climate, scenery, and outdoor opportunities.

With current inexpensive housing prices in Battlement Mesa and limited local demand for housing, ideas were discussed about ways to market the community to other regions.

It was agreed that it would be productive to meet with representatives of Battlement Mesa Company to identify what marketing efforts they were currently using as well as research different marketing companies or organizations to gain an understanding of the most effective marketing efforts.

Also discussed were possible upgrades to the BMSA website that might provide additional marketing resources for the community.



# Public and Community Relations Committee Meeting Update March 18, 2014 BMSA Meeting

#### Overview

The Public and Community Relations Committee's efforts continue to be focused on the following long term goals.

- Maintain and update the new BattlementMesaColorado.com website and promote the site to the extent possible.
   Continue to explore additional opportunities to make the site more useful and interesting.
- In conjunction with the four Northwestern Colorado counties, cities and towns, develop and construct Gateway Interpretative signs for Battlement Mesa/Parachute.
- Develop and implement a marketing and promotional plan to showcase the positive lifestyle available by living in the Battlement Mesa Community.
- Continue to develop relations and interactions with the BMMD, Town of Parachute, Garfield County and State and Federal Government agencies and regulatory bodies for the betterment of the Battlement Mesa Community.

#### **Current Focus**

- Website. Several additions were made to our website, <a href="www.BattlementMesaColorado.com">www.BattlementMesaColorado.com</a> during the month. A new page was added under the Explore Battlement Mesa tab called New Owner Resources. This page is a large index of links which enables the user to quickly identify information that they need about the BMSA or any of the sub-associations then click on the link to immediately visit the page. Additionally, the section on the sub-associations (which is under, Government Services, Village HOA Information and Services, now contains all of the sub-associations information Agendas, Minutes, Financial Reports, Documents, etc. Prior to the change, there was only one page (About Us) for each sub-association. During February's 28 day period, there were 9,232 visits to the Battlement Mesa website, 36,047 page views, and 1,305,905 hits on the site. (Definition of Hit: A hit represents a request to your web site for a file such as an image, a web page, or a CGI script. One web page may contain several related resources, and as a result, a visitor viewing one web page may trigger several hits.)
- Newsletter Our newsletter distribution list stands at 505; up 9. Please encourage people to sign up for this newsletter. (Top of the Home page of website). The February newsletter achieved an open rate of 48% compared to an industry average of 23.9 % and a 18.8 % click through rate compared to January's 10.2% click through rate.
- <u>Showcase Positive Lifestyle</u> We plan to hold a 2014 Insiders' Guide planning meeting the week of February or first week of March. We hope to distribute the Guide about Memorial Day.
- <u>Facebook</u> Our Facebook "friend" list continues at 118 of which only 28 (unchanged) say they "like us." If you have a Facebook account, please join our friend list and, encourage others to do so.
- <u>NWCCHT.</u> The Northwest Colorado Cultural Heritage Tourism group met in Rifle on Monday, March 10th to work on our Gateway Interpretive Signs. We have submitted our sign text and photos to the graphic designer and still expect to install our sign this summer.
- <u>Planning Committee.</u> The PCR committee and Planning committee met on March 4<sup>th</sup> to explore ideas about promoting the community. (Please refer to the Planning committee report for additional information).
- <u>2013 Annual Report to Members.</u> Sara McCurdy, Laurel Koning and I met in late February to discuss the new report content. The first draft of the content plus photos has been submitted to Jen Perez who is going to compile the text and photos into the annual report format.

- Continue working with the NWCCHT on our Gateway Interpretive Sign project which will help promote our community through the construction of new signage promoting the history and geology of our area.
- Continue our efforts to enhance the website with more photos and videos. As time permits, create additional videos

#### Overview:

The AGNC last met on February 20, 2014. The next meeting will be held at in Craig on March 20, 2014. A copy of the February meeting minutes is included with this report. The March Agenda has not yet been published (as of the date this report was prepared).

In addition to the usual agenda items, several guest speakers presented information and insights on several key issues. These speakers included Harry Talbott, Tim Pollard and Louis Meyer.

The local (Palisade) newspaper was at this meeting; however, I do not know if anything about the AGNC's meeting was included in their paper. The AGNC continues to receive considerable mentions in the media.

The weekly conference call with the AGNC's Government Relations Team (Orf & Orf) began on Friday, January 17<sup>th</sup> and will continue weekly throughout the legislative season. 2014 continues to be another year of controversial legislation.

The Northwest Colorado governments continue to be concerned about the Sage Grouse issue and its potential impact to Northwest Colorado's economy as well as about two efforts to add initiatives to the fall ballot. These two are:

- Initiative #72 involving the rights of local governments to pass laws restricting or banning activities without pre-emption.
- Initiative #73 which appears to be intended to be a proposed Constitutional amendment.

<u>Wildfire Mitigation Grant</u>: I met with Kelly Rogers the District Forester from the Grand Junction office and Fire Chief, David Blair of the Grand Valley Fire Protection District to discuss possible grant opportunities for fire mitigation work to be done in Battlement Mesa.

Several areas were identified and discussed that would benefit from mitigation work. However, due to the short time frame for submittal of the grant application and the amount of data necessary to document inventory of fire fuels, detailed mitigation work, appropriate mapping and associated costs, I have delayed a grant submittal until the 2014 fall grant process in order to gather the necessary data.

<u>Committee Meeting Procedures</u>: Based upon a question raised by a community member at a previous BMSA, Board of Director meeting I contacted BMSA attorney, David Firmin. I wanted to assess the procedures of committee meeting notice and the keeping of minutes for those meetings. Historically meeting notices have not been posted for committee meetings and minutes are typically not taken. In most cases a committee report has been provided as an overview of the meeting.

These committee meetings are open to the public but no notice is posted so the public is not aware of the meetings and in most cases there is no set meeting schedule. Technically the committees, except for the Architectural Committee, have no decision making powers and therefore are not required to formally post a meeting notice. However, at times these committees may make recommendations to the Board of Directors which could be considered a decision made at the meeting and in those instances meeting minutes would be appropriate.

My recommendation is to establish set meeting schedules for committee meetings and then post the meetings similar to the Board of Director meetings. I would also recommend committees provide a written report to the Board for each meeting held.
