OWNER'S OPEN FORUM

Lynn Shore-Economic Development

Mr. Shore stated that it is important to diversify Battlement Mesa to mitigate the economic boom/bust cycle that happens with the gas & oil industry. One way to do this is to bring in a tax base by bringing in businesses. Under the current BMSA rules, BMSA charges a common assessment to all commercial businesses for every 500 sq ft of space they are charged 1 common assessment at \$296.00. This could make a huge impact on new businesses wanting to build in Battlement Mesa. This same business could be built elsewhere without having to pay these fees. Mr. Shore stated that to make Battlement Mesa more competitive for new businesses, BMSA needs to give serious consideration to changing this requirement on new businesses. The current businesses could be grandfathered to continue paying the common assessments.

After further discussion concerning the commercial assessment rates the Board agreed to delay further discussion until later in the meeting.

Declarant Schmela reported that winterfest is scheduled for January 31, 2015.

Declarant Gallegos reported that the bids for landscaping and civil engineering have been awarded for Phase 2 of the new park.

BMSA Financial Committee

January 20, 2015 Report on Financial Documents

For December 2014

End of Financial Year

Operating Accounts

This report is for the twelfth and final month of our financial year. We end the year in a positive position. Copies of the December 2014 financial documents have been submitted to the Financial Committee and copies have been included in your packets. These have been reviewed and we find them in a complete and accurate subject to an audit.

On the income side, Developer and Common Assessments fell short by a small amount. However, similar to last month, Fines were higher than budget; late Fees were substantly lower than budget which can be interpreted in a positive manner. Also, as noted last month, Fines continue to exceed budget amounts. Miscellaneous Revenues continue to be higher than budget. These reflect rebates from Holy Cross and other miscellaneous items.

On the expense side Bank Charges, Right-of-way Open Space Maintenance, Tree Trimming, Street Light Maintenance, Street Sign Maintenance and Bad Debts continue to exceed Budget amounts. On the positive side, Covenant Enforcement, Legal Services, Land Scape Maintenance, Irrigation Water, Street Light Electricity are significantly below budgeted amounts. All over-the-budget amounts are understandable. The new Budget for 2015 has adjusted for these items.

The bottom line shows revenues exceeding expenses for the yearend of \$31,967.

On the Balance Sheet, the Accounts Receivable is substantially less than last month \$93,745 as expected. We anticipate receiving a substantial amount of these Receivables. Those not collected will be written off.

Reserve Accounts

We also reviewed the Reserve Accounts invested with Edward Jones. The Income side was as budgeted. The expenditures were less than budget leaving a positive \$41,872. The monies placed with Edward Jones are earning small amounts but as required they are invested in secured funds.

The Public and Community Relations Committee's efforts continue to be focused on the following long term goals.

- In conjunction with the four Northwestern Colorado counties, cities and towns, develop and construct Gateway Interpretative signs for Battlement Mesa/Parachute.
- Develop and implement a marketing and promotional plan to showcase the positive lifestyle available by living in the Battlement Mesa Community.
- Continue to develop relations and interactions with the BMMD, Town of Parachute, Garfield County and State and Federal Government agencies and regulatory bodies for the betterment of the Battlement Mesa Community.

Current Focus

- Website. During December 2014, there were 10,730 visits to the Battlement Mesa website, and 52,039 page views on the site and 1,084,526 hits. (Definition of Hit: A hit represents a request to your web site for a file such as an image, a web page, or a CGI script. One web page may contain several related resources, and as a result, a visitor viewing one web page may trigger several hits.).
- Newsletter Our newsletter distribution list stands at 571 up 1. Please encourage people to sign up for this newsletter. (Top of the Home page of website). The December Newsletter attained a 50% open rate and 10% click through rate. The January 2015 Newsletter was distributed on January 15th.
- <u>Showcase Positive Lifestyle</u> We will not be able to publish a 2014 Insiders' Guide due to the loss of our publishing partner, (Grand Valley Echo). We will continue to explore alternatives and would welcome any suggestions.
- <u>Facebook</u> Our Facebook page has been completely revamped and we are trying to make it more active and hopefully more engaging with more frequent updates. We now have 134 "likes" If you have a Facebook account, please join our friend list and, encourage others to do so. BMSA Board of Directors Meeting January 20, 2015 Associated Governments of Northwest Colorado Committee Update

Last Meeting: December 5, 2014 Attended by: Keith Lammey Next Meeting: February 18, 2015

Overview:

The AGNC last met on December 5, 2014 in Parachute, Colorado at the Parachute Town Hall. As previously reported, Scott McGinnis resigned as the Association's Executive Director and Bonnie Peterson was hired as the new Executive Director. Ms. Peterson previously served at the Executive Director for Club 20.

Since the Colorado Legislative Session has begun, so has the weekly AGNC legislative session review calls. These conference calls are held at noon on Fridays and often last over an hour. Participants engage in a discussion of the bills which are being considered by the State Legislators and decide whether they want to take a position for, against or simply monitor bills that have been identified as having a potential impact on Northwest Colorado. I represent Battlement Mesa on these weekly calls. These calls are led by the AGNC Chair with assistance from the AGNC's Government Relations Team, Orf & Orf.

Street Light LED Retrofits: I was notified by Holy Cross Energy this past month that the BMSA will receive a rebate of \$25,400 for the street light LED retrofits completed this past year.

Architectural Inspector Contract: BMSA Management was contacted this past week by a building contractor concerning the construction of a new residence in the 1st Eagles Point subdivision. In reviewing the architectural review requirements it occurred to us that the BMSA does not currently have a contract in place to conduct the inspections of the residence. No new residences have been conducted in Battlement Mesa during the last six years so a new contract had not been approved. I have contacted the previous contractor, Keith Sheppleman, to see if he is interested in renewing a contract with the BMSA. Mr. Sheppleman has indicated that he is interested in a new contract. I would recommend the Board enter into a contract with Mr. Sheppleman which would go into effect once a building permit has been issued by the County Planning Department.

Maintenance Items: This past month fence pickets and broken posts were repaired/replaced along Stone Quarry Road in the Saddleback Village and Tamarisk Village areas. Two faded "Snow Plow Route" signs were replaced in Battlement Creek Village and two new signs were added in the Reserve.

2014 BMSA Operations Recap: The financial position of the BMSA remains strong as 2014 year end reserves accrued to \$828,000. This was despite capital expenditures of \$144,000 for LED retrofits of street lights, Battlement Parkway median improvements, tree replacement in the common areas and irrigation improvements and hydro-seeding of the property at 8935 CR 300.
